3. Communication

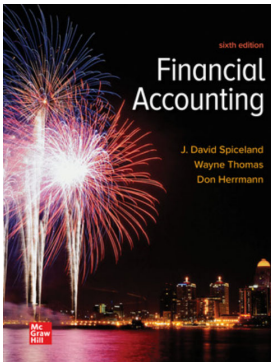
- Developing effective oral, written and group communication skills.

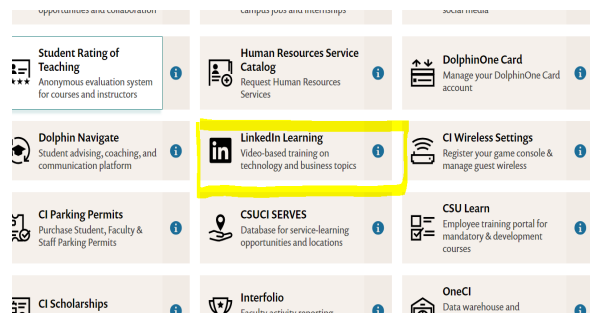
