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COURSE OVERVIEW: The purpose of this course is to familiarize you with basic microeconomic concepts. You should expect to develop an appreciation for and understanding of microeconomic principles and methods. We will discuss fundamental topics such as tradeoffs, economic efficiency, demand and supply, and markets. Microeconomic analysis and reasoning are ubiquitously applied in industry and government policy, and we will discuss these applications at several points as we progress through the course material. You will learn how individuals and firms make economic decisions, how markets work, and how to think like an economist.

GRADING: Your letter grades (+/- allowed) will be assigned using a cumulative score based on five Aplia problem sets (homework assignments), two midterm exams, and a final exam, weighted as follows:

Problem sets: 25%
Midterm exam 1: 20%
Midterm exam 2: 20%
Final exam: 35%

Grades will be assigned approximately as follows: >90%: A; 80%-90%: B; 70%-80%: C; 60%-70%: D, <60%: F.

CLASS PARTICIPATION: You are expected and strongly encouraged to attend all scheduled classes, to be prepared to engage in class by answering and asking questions and participating in discussions, and to read beforehand the chapters that are going to be covered each week. If you do not attend a class, it is your responsibility to make arrangements to ensure you catch up on the material covered and on any other information provided.

HOMEWORK: Problem sets will be assigned via Aplia. Collaboration on problem sets is not allowed, and collaboration of any kind on problem sets will be considered a violation of academic regulations.

EXAMINATIONS: There are two midterm examinations (20% each) and one cumulative final exam (35%). All exams are closed book. You may use a simple calculator. The use of laptops and smartphones during exams is strictly prohibited (therefore, for example, you may not use a calculator app on your smartphone).

No make-up exams will be held. If you have a valid and approved reason (characterized by severe and unforeseen hardship, and substantiated with documentation) for missing an examination, then the weight of the exam you missed will be added to the weight of the next exam. Importantly, if you miss an examination without a valid and approved reason, you will receive a score of zero for that examination.
